<p>Tsitsikamma Canopy Tours</p> <p>The first of its kind in Africa, the canopy tour involves zip-lining from one platform to another along a steel cable suspended up to 30 meters above the forest floor.</p> <p>Discover the secrets of the spectacular and unique wilderness of Tsitsikamma Indigenous Forest. As you enter the forest you'll encounter Hard Pear trees, Giant Yellow Woods, beautiful Tree Ferns hundreds of years old and other interesting Forest Flora. Stand beside a colossal Outeniqua Yellowwood and feel like a dwarf against this spectacular giant.</p> <p>The tour consists of ten slides (the longest one measures 91m), each ending on a platform constructed in the trees. No climbing or jumping is necessary.</p> <p>From the start on the launch platform, a new world unfolds as one gently glides through the treetops. The platforms built high up in the giant Outeniqua Yellowwoods, provide an unbelievable view of this enchanting forest.</p> <p>Birdlife is abundant (including Knysna Loerie's and the elusive Narina Trogon), and your guides will explain the ecology of this lush primeval forest. 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<p>Monkeyland and Birds of Eden</p> <p>Monkeyland: Monkeyland Primate Sanctuary is the world's first multi species, free roaming primate sanctuary providing ex-captive primates with a healthier, more natural life. Around 500 apes, monkeys and lemurs live at Monkeyland including gibbons, langurs, saki, capuchin, squirrel, vervet, howler and spider monkeys along with black and white ruffed and ring-tailed lemurs in 12 hectares of pristine indigenous forest.</p> <p>Birds of Eden: Birds of Eden is the largest single dome free flight aviary in the world. The sanctuary encompasses an area of over 2 hectares of natural forest and waterways, criss-crossed by some 1.2km of walkways. Visitors here are welcome to explore at their own pace with the aid of the Birds of Eden specialised guidebook or with one of the experienced guides. <p>Stargazing High 5 Celestial Tour</p> <p>It was once said that the only thing we know for sure about the universe is that there is an inside, nobody knows if there is an outside. The cosmos is said to be approximately 15 000 - 20 000 million years old. Earth came into existence approximately 4 600 million years ago and has undergone major changes since then. The galaxy is commonly known as the Milky Way and is one of hundreds of millions of other galaxies that have been discovered over many years. Galaxies "normally" tend to group together, and the Milky Way is one of a group of 30 galaxies. When conditions are very favourable another massive galaxy can be observed in the Northern Hemisphere. This galaxy is known as M31 or Andromeda and is 2 300 000 light years away. This is also the furthest object to be seen anywhere with the naked eye.
